PSA- Ilocos Sur hands over the 2022 CBMS data to LGU Santa Catalina, Ilocos Sur

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LGU Santa Catalina and PSA officials sign the Data Turnover Agreement (DTA) of the 2022 CBMS, signifying the LGU's readiness to generate data for local planning.

SANTA CATALINA, ILOCOS SUR- The Municipality of Santa Catalina envisions a local government that improves the lives of its constituents, a dream that is becoming a reality as it ties a collaborative project with the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) through the implementation of the Community-Based Monitoring System (CBMS).

The Local Government Unit (LGU) took part in the 2022 CBMS operations and successfully completed its data processing, which thoroughly checks its consistency, completeness, and accuracy. The data turnover ceremony signifies the LGU Santa Catalina's readiness to prepare and generate tabulations required for local planning, policy formulation, and project implementation.

On 25 January 2024, the PSO Staff led the Data Turnover Ceremony (DTC), where the LGU, under the leadership of Hon. Mayor Edgar R. Rapanut, CPA, accompanied by key officials and department heads, including the Municipal Planning and

Development Coordinator (MPDC) Angelo Javier B. Rapisura, joined and witnessed this momentous event.

Furthermore, the program gained significance with the esteemed presence of Atty. Sheila O. De Guzman, the Regional Director of PSA Regional Statistical Services Office I (RSSO I), who warmly welcomed participants to the event. RD De Guzman personally handed over the 2022 CBMS data to the local chief executives and representatives of the CBMS participating LGUs. Ms. Jeanette M. Marzan, the Chief Statistical Specialist of PSA- Ilocos Sur, then presented the key highlights of the 2022 CBMS results in Santa Catalina.

Mayor Rapanut wholeheartedly embraced the data generated from the CBMS, expressing sincere appreciation to the PSA for providing support to the LGU to generate essential data to specifically address the needs of its constituents.


